We understand that due to the ongoing circumstances, some of you are undecided. Therefore, we have extended the submission deadline <u>until March 18th, 2024</u> and we kindly remind you of the possibility of participating virtually.

The tri-annual AIHV congresses are the place where we as a glass-researching community grow and strengthen from the possibility of meeting our peers, exchanging ideas, and gaining knowledge. Please consider this, in making your final decision.

Presentations/Contributions

The Congress themes are expected to focus on the history, archaeology, technology, archaeometry, and conservation of glass of all periods from around the world.

Oral presentations should not exceed 20 minutes. The official languages are English, French, and German. There will be no simultaneous translation.
